Trailing Pahang's Heritage

25 September 2010. Trailing Pahang's Heritage was the primary idea. Thus, in collaboration with Majlis Bekas Wakil Rakyat (MUBARAK) and Pahang State Government, Centre for Modern Languages and Human Sciences (CMLHS) and Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP) held a prestigious two-day programme, 'Wacana Mengingati Sejarah: Ke Arah Kecemerlangan Masa Depan' (A Discourse in Reminiscing History: Towards Future Excellence). It was one of the programmes organised in conjunction with the 80th birthday celebration of Sultan Pahang, HRH Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah Al-Musta'in Billah Ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Abu Bakar Ri'ayatuddin Al-Mu'Adzam Shah.

The event was to highlight Pahang's Heritage at the national arena and to set a platform for discussions among intellects and experts in the fields about preserving the heritage as well as to inculcate the spirit of patriotism, moral values and self-identity especially to the younger generations.

The event addressed Pahang politics, economic, social and religious heritage. Among the distinguished intellects and experts in the fields invited as speakers to discuss the matter in a forum entitled 'Mengingati Sejarah ke Arah Kecemerlangan Masa Hadapan' were YDH Dato' Sri Wan Abdul Wahid Wan Hassan from Majlis Ugama Islam dan Adat Resam Melayu Pahang (MUIP), YH Dato' Dr. Mohamed Najib Ahmad Dawa from Akademi Seni Budaya dan Warisan Kebangsaan (ASWARA), YB Datuk Professor Dr. Zainal Kling Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI) and YB Professor Emeritus Dato' Dr. Nik Hassan Shuhaimi Nik Abd. Rahman from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM). 

CMLHS Pioneering UMP-German Programme

12 July 2010. Beginning July 2010, UMP offered a Dual Degree Programme in Mechatronics Engineering with Hochschule Karlsruhe Technik und Wirtschaft (HsKA) University for the Faculty of Manufacturing Engineering and Technology Management (FKPPT). Under this dual degree programme, students who undergo this programme will be awarded by both institutions, UMP and HsKA.

To prepare the students who were selected for the programme, a three month Preparatory Intensive German Course was designed and carried out from July 2010 to September 2010. CMLHS was responsible to offer the course which was conducted by visiting lecturers, Nadia Meryem Amroune and Rita Steinforth. Classes ran daily from 8am till 5pm. Aside from CMLHS, this UMP-German programme was also monitored by UMP International German Office (IGO).

Currently, the students are in their first semester which began in October 2010. Joining them are students from other institutions like German Malaysian Institute (GMI) and International Education Centre (INTEC) of UITM. They are learning UHG1002 (Deutsch Sprache 1) an introductory course to the German language that comprises all the skills required to be acquire the language.

The programme is offered to all qualified SPM and A Level candidates.

The centre, in an effort to support the establishment of a new faculty, sent four delegates to the Organization for Industrial, Spiritual and Cultural Advancement (OISCA) International Malaysian Chapter (OIMC) headquarters in Kuala Lumpur (KL). The meeting was to discuss the possibility of establishing a close tie between CMLHS and OIMC by assessing the areas in which both parties are able to contribute for the benefit of UMP students in particular.

The team which was headed by Munira Abdul Razak, the Deputy Dean of Academic Affairs had an initial meeting with the Vice President of OIMC, Y. Bhg. Dato' Mohd Sofian Abd. Rahim.

As a Non Governmental Organisation (NGO) which dwells in domestic and international issues particularly in relation to youth, OIMC has expressed interests in contributing towards youth development in UMP.

The organisation is strongly supported by its various branches from 36 different countries all over the world. Every year, OISCA arranges potential youths to join a programme in which they have to undergo vocational and industrial trainings in Japan. It is our hope that this initial discussion of collaboration between CMLHS and OIMC will open another pathway for UMP students to gain beneficial experience in the global arena.

Meanwhile, CMLHS, was represented by its management team headed by the Dean, Professor Dr. Abd Jalil Borham. The input gained from the meeting was very crucial towards the development of the four new programmes.

The panels verbalized their hopes to see the proposed programmes to become a reality because they could see that the programmes had clear prospects not only in industries but also to the society. Furthermore, the programmes appear to fill in the 'gaps' we have in the current job market especially in halal industries.

CMLHS is trusted once again to conduct this course in collaboration with the Human Resource Department of the University. The first batch of 33 participants took this course for four days on 29 September, 6 October, 3 and 15 November 2010. To be confirmed, they should pass the exam with a Band 5.

Like the Course on IELTS for Academicians, the content of the course includes an Introduction and Overview, Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. The only difference is that for non academic staff, the module is the General Training Module, a module that is normally taken if one wants to migrate and secure employment overseas.

and learning of various languages offered by the centre using


technology. Users are able to have high quality voice, audio as



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BOOK REVIEW

To some, racism and religion are interrelated issues that are too complex and sensitive to be openly addressed. Yet, it is a serious subject matter that needs specific elucidations for a country with various ethnic communities and religions like Malaysia. Especially in this era, racism is a severe disease and finding the right antidote seems to have an endless journey. Many ideas have been formulated by scholars in building a sincere relationship between races. However, it somehow fails to get to core of the problem: the racial discrimination in the people's mentality. Regardless of the wide spread messages on the concept of equality among ethnic relations promoted in Islam, the ideas thus far, are not fully well received by large, the media in particular; resulting a Malaysian society today, who is by large, still vague in comprehending the true spirit of brotherhood particularly on the relationship between Muslim and the non Muslim. The book provides an educated platform to discuss these issues using the Qur'an, the Sunnah and Mukta'bar Islamic Scholars as its fundamentals. Academic debates are being promoted widely as the main method of discussion which highlights the strength of arguments and facts where personal interest or emotion is in exclusion. Indeed, it is a must read material for those who are interested in knowing more and experience the graciousness in the teaching of Islam.
